

Boat Technician Check List

Dress code (remember you are working with the public)

- NO big holes in your clothes
- NO short shorts (If you want to wear shorts they HAVE to be past your knees)
- NO sleeveless shirts
- NO sandals (you will need boots or tennis shoes)
- NO shirts with bad language or bad symbols on it.

You don't need to go buy new clothes for this job. You will most likely ruin a few pants and shirts due to the fact you are working with gas, oil and dirt all day! We just ask you look decent to work around consumers!

Things to bring

1. Sleeping bag and or blankets/ pillow
2. At least 2 pairs of shoes/boots
3. 4 or 5 days worth of clothes (we do have a washing machine)
4. Laundry detergent
5. Personal items (tooth brush/tooth paste, towel, shampoo/soap, razors/shaving cream, lotion/sun screen, deodorant, etc.
6. Extra pairs of socks (you work by a lake and it rains a lot--your feet will get wet!!!)
7. Rain coat
8. Working gloves
9. A warm jacket/ sweat shirts
10. Extra food or snacks
11. Water or Gatorade
12. Some spending money
13. A willing attitude to work!
